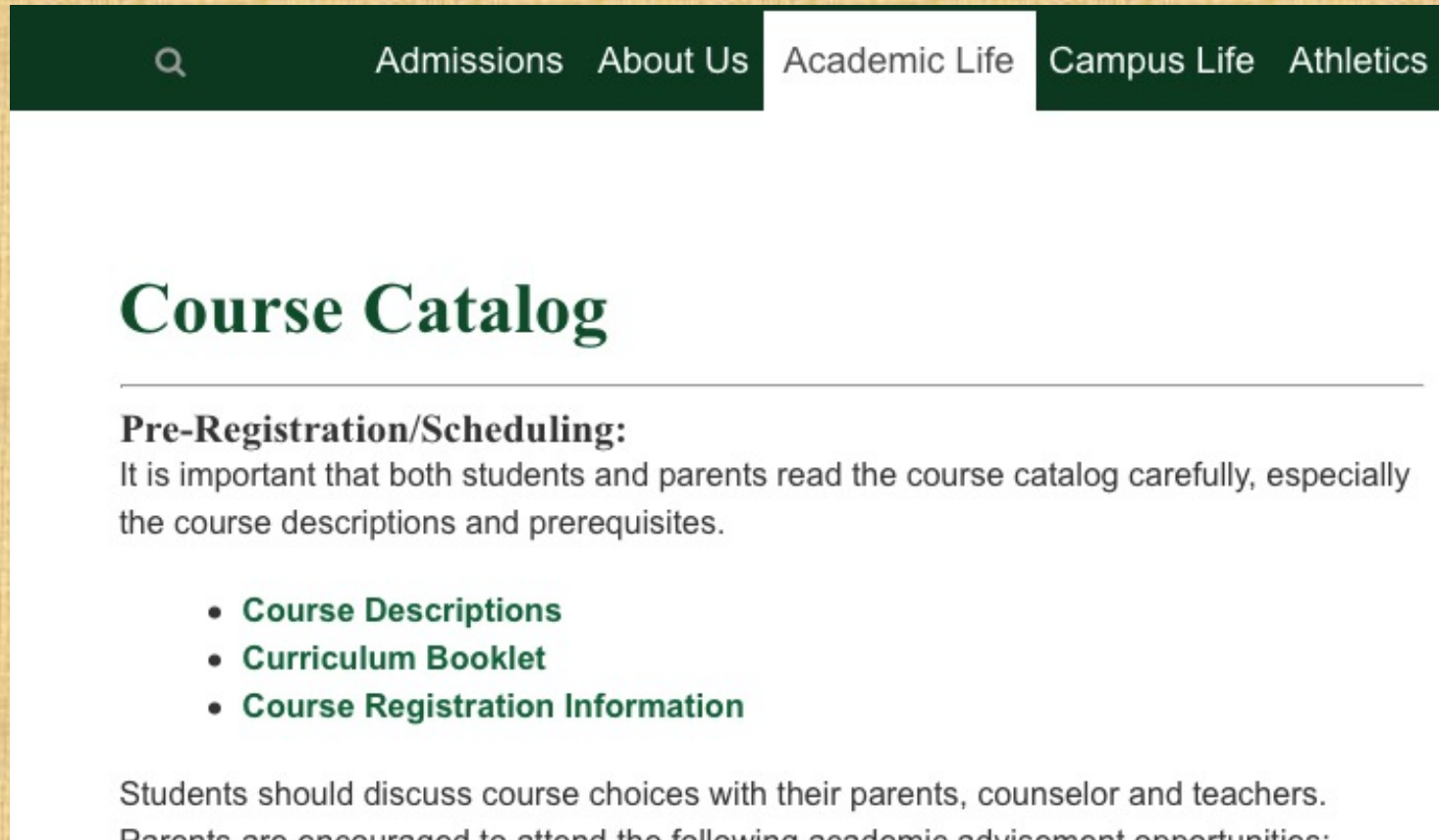

Honors Courses

- All students who want to take Honors/AP courses and DO NOT meet the prerequisites must fill out a Google appeal form.
- *The appeal Google form is online on the Registration webpage.*
- *Check recommended prerequisites for each Honors/AP course. This list is online.*
- Due Date: Feb 24th for Honors/AP appeals

Appealing for an Honors/AP course

- If you do not meet the prerequisites for an Honors/AP course, you will need to appeal (Google form).
- *The appeal will go to the department chair and will be reviewed by the department.*
- *You may be placed on a waiting list until you are approved for the course.*
- *Those appealing will have their grades reviewed at the end of the second semester to confirm placement.*

Registration

- You are required to take **10 Units** from the following subjects:
 - Religion
 - Math
 - English
 - Science
 - Social Studies

An addition for next year

- **Next year freshmen and sophomores will be taking seven classes per semester (this year it was six classes).**
- **This does not apply to next year's seniors.**
- **You still need to have 60 units for the year. You may take more, if you wish.**

Before we review the courses...

- **Print your name** at top of your worksheet
- **Print February 13th** near name (it is when we start meeting to register you)
- Mark **DLS Only** (if you wish courses at DLS)
- As we go through the courses, you can check off (in pencil) the ones you think you will probably be taking (or circle the ones you have questions about)
- Your current teachers will sign your form
- Parents will need to sign your form before you register

- Course descriptions are in catalog – sign up for courses that fit your interests: many options for this!
- You need your English teacher's signature for AP courses

Social Studies

- Three years of Social Studies is required for graduation and college entrance
- You must meet the prerequisites for any AP courses
- Civics is a required course unless you take AP Government
- You will need your US History teacher's signature for the AP placement.
- You may have the option to take an extra Social Studies course.

- **You need 2.5 years of science to graduate**
- **Three full years are recommended for UC/CSU college entrance.**
 - **You must have a physical AND biological science:**
 - **Chemistry or Physics fulfill this requirement**
 - **Selective colleges would like to see you take BOTH**
- **If you are considering a four-year college, you MUST have a minimum of two lab sciences.**
- **Engineering/Robotics is an elective only. It does not replace Physics.**

- **Must have 20 credits to graduate (if you transferred after 9th grade, you will need to meet the 20 credit requirement)**
- **Freshman Health counts towards five credits**
- **Fitness, Fundamentals of BK, Weight Training can be taken more than once.**
- **You can also meet 15 units of PE credits with:**
 - **Three separate seasons of a team sport (limit of 5 credits per year)**
- **If insufficient PE credits on transcript then you will be registered for PE next year.**
- **Band members: If you play band three years (both 0 and 7th periods), you need to petition for five PE credits toward your 20 credit requirement**
