## Honors Courses

## Appealing for an Honors/AP course

- If you do not meet the prerequisites for an Honors/AP course, you will need to appeal (Google form).
The appeal will go to the department chair and will be reviewed by the department.
- You may be placed on a waiting list until you are approved for the course.
Those appealing will have their grades reviewed at the end of the second semester to confirm placement.

## English

You need four years of English in order to graduate

English, OR TWO semester-long courses. (choose three classes and rank them 1, 2, 3 only if you are not choosing a year long course)
Course descriptions are in catalog - sign up for courses that fit your interests: many options for this!
You need your English teacher's signature for AP courses

## Social Studies

Three years of Social Studies is required for graduation and college entrance
You must meet the prerequisites for any AP courses
Civics is a required course unless you take AP Government You will need your US History teacher's signature for the AP placement.

- Three separate seasons of a team sport (limit of 5 credits per year)

If insufficient PE credits on transcript then you will be registered for PE next year.

- Band members: If you play band three years (both 0 and $7^{\text {th }}$ periods), you need to petition for five PE credits toward your 20 credit requirement
